## HARVARD PILGRIM HEALTH CARE FOUNDATION HOSTS 9<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL COMMUNITY SPIRIT AWARDS HONORING FOUR RECIPIENTS FOR COMMITMENT TO COMMUNITY

Robert Lewis, Jr., president and founder of the BASE, reflects on own personal journey of community work

(Quincy, MA) May 3, 2017—The Harvard Pilgrim Health Care Foundation honored four individuals and organizations for their significant volunteer contributions to their communities as part of the Foundation's 9th annual Community Spirit Awards held this morning at its offices in Quincy, Mass. Robert Lewis, Jr, founder and president of The BASE, an organization that leverages sports as a vehicle to engage youth, joined Eric Schultz, president and CEO of Harvard Pilgrim Health Care, and Janelle Woods-McNish, Director of Employee Service and Giving for Harvard Pilgrim Health Care Foundation to highlight the importance and value of community volunteerism.

• Community Spirit Volunteer: Rebecca Shannon, Senior Sales Analyst, Harvard Pilgrim Health Care, Wellesley

She created a survey to find out what the team is interested in doing and then scheduled volunteer opportunities accordingly. She also ensured that each member of our team awarded their Mini-Grant. Tania encouraged a group of us to volunteer with Cradles to Crayons and the Boston Health Care for the Homeless Program and she is a true supportive leader who constantly makes caring, developing and communicating a top priority for her team!"

## • Community Spirit Team: Worcester office, Harvard Pilgrim Health Care
